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Pewamo-Westphalia Elementary School Annual Education Report (AER)

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Pewamo-Westphalia Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality information. For the 2022-23 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2022-23. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2022-23. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

P-W Elementary will continue to assess all math and reading students and provide interventions for students who qualify for extra support. We will also focus intervention efforts on our students who qualify as English learners.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Students who live in the district are assigned to P-W Elementary School. We also accept students who live outside of the district during our open enrollment period.
2. P-W Elementary continues to make good progress on our School Improvement Plan goals and objectives using the Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process.
3. Our district does not have any specialized schools.
4. Parents are able to access our curriculum by contacting the main office at P-W Elementary School.
5. We do not use local competency tests or nationally normed achievement tests.
6. P-W Elementary has 100% participation in our Fall parent/teacher conferences.

P-W Elementary School has been recognized as one of the top elementary schools in the State of Michigan, and we are proud of the dedication of our staff and students. We will continue to push our students to achieve the high standards that we set and will support them along the way.
